COMMUNITY WELLNESS

The community mental health needs continue to increase as well as severity of cases. In 2022 we served more than 620 people for mental health services. With community support we were able to provide -14% - Spanish or bilingual individuals -83% - improved their mental health status -1,833 free therapy sessions (youth & adults) funding provided by other payment sources.



PREVENTION EDUCATION

2022 was a big year for Family Service, Inc.'s Prevention Education programming! Not only did we return to in person presentations at BCSC, but we were also fortunate to be able to share body safety and healthy relationships education with several other schools in the county. Body safety and healthy relationships education continues to be a need for youth, to understand and know what is not safe and how to report. We provided prevention education to over 25,000 individuals.

- -170 youth Monique Burr anti-bully practices.and healthy relationships presentations.




