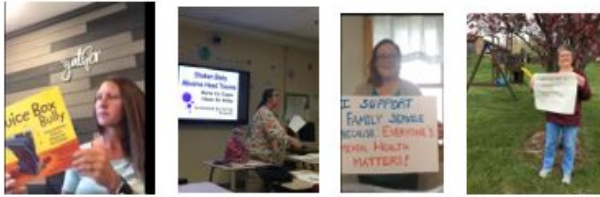

Mental Health Counseling



- ✦ Provided Individual and family counseling to more than 530 adult and child consumers.
- ✦ Transitioned to teletherapy services.
- ✦ Provided 47 individuals with a variety of mental health educational presentations throughout the year.

Child Abuse Prevention Education



- ✦ Educated more than 10,300 individuals about child abuse prevention.
- ✦ Provided 79 Play it Safe Presentations to Youth.
- ✦ Provided 115 Bully Prevention Presentations to Youth.
- ✦ Provided 416 parents/caregivers with the Period of Purple Crying Bedside education at CRH.
- ✦ Provided infant and toddler Safety presentations to 94 students.
- ✦ Distributed more than 1,200 pinwheels throughout the community.

Covid-19 Impact

2020 was a year of unprecedented challenges. With the help of our amazing community, Family Service, Inc. faced those challenges head on and continued to provide services while doing our part to help stop the spread of the virus. We completely transitioned our service model to teletherapy. Teletherapy was introduced to help us safely meet the mental health needs of our community. Our child abuse prevention programs began operating through virtual presentations to accommodate the new school policies and assist with keeping students safe. Through all the challenges and changes we were still able to provide quality service to over 10,900 community members. To help meet new hospital operating guidelines, we transitioned our crying education program to the CRH staff so that families would still receive vital information on the Period of Purple Crying and infant safety. Thanks to additional grant funding from United Way of Bartholomew County, Carl Marshal & Mildred Almen Reeves Foundation and First Presbyterian Church Foundation, we were able to provide nearly 900 free therapy sessions to individuals and families who needed services but who were burdened by financial constraints due to the pandemic. All staff were able to complete Emotional CPR training and Implicit Bias & Anti-Racism training. Yes, 2020 was a year of challenges but we rose to those challenges and are ready to hedge forward into 2021.

We offered a client's mom the opportunity to use the UW grant. Mom expressed her sincere gratitude for this gift. She shared that during this time it allows her to ensure her child's mental wellbeing can be maintained and they can continue to grow. She was so excited and cried when I told her. --Charlotte

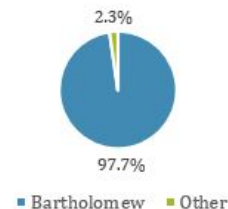

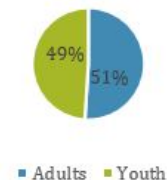

Agency Demographics

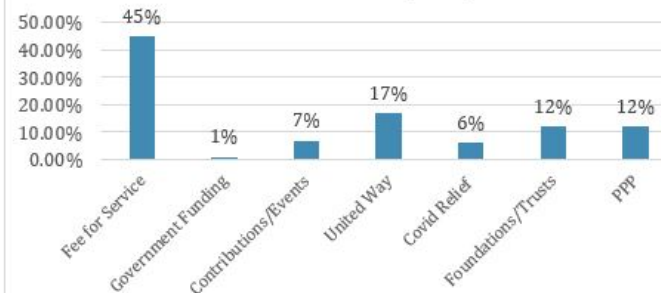
Population Served by County of Residence

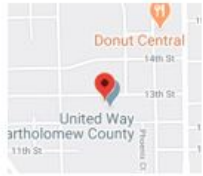
